The Declaration of Independence itself, as we have it today, is in the hand-writing of an Irishman, Charles Thompson, the Secretary of Congress: and was first printed by another, Captain Dunlap, and was first read to the public by yet another Irishman, Captain Nixon.

There were eight Irish signers to the Declaration

## Three born in Ireland:

James Smith born in Northern Ireland 1719

Matthew Thornton born in Ireland 1714

George Taylor born in Ireland came to America as indentured servant

## Five were born in America.

Edward Rutledge, Father came from Co. Cavan Charles Carroll Ill, Only Roman Catholic signer

Thomas Lynch, Jr., Died younger (30 yrs) than any other signer

George Read Father was from Dublin

Thomas McKean. Last person to sign the Declaration.
